
Victor Garden Club

If you have visited Victor lately, we hope you would have seen the new "Town of Victor" Gateway Sign at the Burger King intersection of four corners NYS Route 96/ Main Street Fishers/Rowley Road. The sign is in addition to the four flower beds filled with fuchsia and purple petunia, as well as beautiful, cascading hanging baskets and American flags that are part of Victor Garden Club's continued civic beautification efforts.
