#### Residential Electronics Recycling

The eWASTE Alliance Network consists of over 300 Residential Collection Sites developed to be a convenient option for residential generators to recycle their eWASTE. All of the eWASTE Alliance Network collection sites are registered with the NYS DEC.

Please call the collection site to verify what they accept. Click on the location name for the phone number.

#### ITEMS ACCEPTED AT OUR COLLECTION SITES:

- Computers (including laptops, desktops, tablets and e-readers)
- Televisions
- Cathode ray tubes
- Small scale servers
- Computer peripherals (including any cable, cord, or wiring permanently affixed to or incorporated into the computer peripheral.)
- Monitors
- Electronic keyboards
- Electronic mice or similar pointing devices
- Facsimile machines, document scanners, and printers (only those intended for use with a computer and weighing less than 100 lbs.)
- Small electronic equipment (including any cable, cord, or wiring permanently affixed to or incorporated into the small electronic equipment.)
- VCRs
- Digital video recorders
- Portable digital music players
- DVD players (including projectors with DVD player capabilities intended for home-use)
- Digital converter boxes
- Cable or satellite receivers (including digital media receivers)
- Electronic or video game consoles (including both handheld devices and those intended for use with a video display device)

#### ITEMS WE DO NOT ACCEPT AT OUR COLLECTION SITES:

Alkaline Batteries, Household Appliances (Toaster Ovens, Hairdryers), Liquids/Oils, Air Conditioners/Dehumidifiers/Refrigerators, Fluorescent Lamp Material, & Tape Media.

#### **Attention Residential Customers:**

Beginning October 19, 2015, there will be a nominal handling fee for all non-SONY brand Cathode Ray Tube (CRT) Televisions and CRT Monitors dropped off for recycling at the RCR&R facility at 7318 Victor-Mendon Rd in Victor NY.

#### **Nominal Handling Fees:**

Non-Sony CRT's Televisions and Monitors 27" and Smaller - **\$20**

Non-SONY CRT's Televisions\* larger than 27" - **\$40**

All SONY televisions are recycled **free of charge.**

\*Also includes DLP, Rear Projection, and Wood Console

Additionally, in accordance with the NYS Electronic Equipment Recycling & Reuse Act, if you've recently purchased a new SONY covered electronic product or device, we'll recycle a like-product (any brand accepted) on a one-to-one basis, free of charge. Just bring in your receipt as proof of your SONY purchase at the time you are recycling your old device.

#### Questions & Answers:

##### Q: Is it legal to charge consumers for recycling in New York State?

A: Yes - It is legal for collection sites and recyclers to charge consumers for recycling however the manufacturers cannot take credit for pounds that consumers pay for (manufacturers have volume requirements per law)

##### Q: Where Can I take my CRT's for free recycling?

A: We are not aware of a free CRT collection site in our area. You can go to the NYS DEC website below and identify the specific brand of CRT you have and research the free program that specific manufacturers offer in NYS.

##### Q: I used to be able to recycle my CRT TVs and CRT Monitors for free at RCR&R, why is there a cost now?

A: The cost associated with proper recycling of CRT televisions and monitors has risen dramatically and the funding under the New York State Electronics Recycling & Reuse Act (EPR Law) and is not sufficient to cover all of these costs. After several years of RCR&R subsidizing the costs of proper CRT recycling, it is now necessary for RCR&R to directly charge a small fee to properly handle and recycle CRT's.

##### Q: Why does it cost money to recycle CRT's but not my other electronics?

A: The total cost to collect and properly recycle residential waste exceeds the typical manufacturer reimbursement offered under the law. The main issues are the high cost to properly recycle CRT containing devices and the elevated percentage of CRT devices (over 80%) in the residential waste stream. CRT's contain 4lbs to 8lbs of hazardous leaded glass. To properly recycle CRT devices, we must receive adequate funding from either the consumers who purchased and used the CRT device or the manufacturers who made the CRT device. The nationwide glut of leaded CRT glass and the abandonment of warehouses filled with leaded CRT glass is a major issue. RCR&R is not going to add to the problem by collecting this material without adequate funding to properly recycle it.

##### Q: Why are SONY CRT's free to recycle?

A: SONY has engaged RCR&R to collect EWASTE in NYS on their behalf. SONY subsidizes the cost of processing CRT's covering the resident's portion of the processing fee.

## **CRT Handling Fee – Effective October 19, 2015:**

### **WHY THIS IS HAPPENING:**

- **Insufficient Funding Under the New York State Extended Producer Responsibility law (EPR) also known as the New York State Electronics Recycling & Reuse Act**
  - The costs associated with proper management of CRT-Containing Devices includes: Leaded CRT Glass processing, logistics, handling, and recycling, regulatory reporting.
  - Per Law, Manufacturers are responsible to fund recycling but the volume they are responsible to fund is limited and the dollar amount of funding is not sufficient to recycle CRT containing devices.
  
- **Nationwide CRT-GLASS DISPOSAL CRISIS – CRT (Cathode Ray Tube) Devices account for over 80% of the residential eWASTE recycling stream.**
  - CRTs are very expensive to handle and recycle properly. CRT Devices Contain Hazardous Leaded Glass and require special treatment (glass separation, cleaning, Lead smelting)
  - EPR Laws in 24 states – “FREE” & Convenient Recycling has created a glut of material in the marketplace
  - CRT Landfill Bans across the country including in New York State have forced CRTs into recycling channels
  - Technology Conversion from CRT -TV to LCD-TV has eliminated CRT “Glass to Glass” recycling because there is no longer a demand for CRT-Containing devices.
  - CRT’s Devices contain hazardous-lead-containing CRT glass with very few certified processing facilities to properly handle volume
  
- **Shared Responsibility – As a consumer in New York State, you have a legal responsibility to properly recycle your electronics; you can no longer dispose of electronics in a landfill. Without sufficient Manufacturer Funding, the cost to recycle CRT’s falls back on the consumer as it did prior to the EPR law.**
